## All You Can Learn Buffet: Fellows/USA Offers a Smorgasbord of Graduate Choices

Many returned Peace Corps Volunteers, when they hear of the educational opportunities offered by Fellows/USA, think it only applies to some RPCVs. “That’s just about getting an MA in education, right?” some wonder. Or, “Isn’t that a program for people who only want to do public policy, or save the environment?” Granted, the answers to these questions get at a real truth: Education, public policy, and environmental issues are all served by many, and in some cases the oldest and largest of the Fellows/USA programs, but this is by no means the only answer. Fellows/USA is expanding at an astonishing rate, and with the new universities joining the program come more new and different educational opportunities for RPCVs.

Offerings which stand out from the others because of their uniqueness are often as different from one another as they are from the stereotypical programs. Georgia College and State University, for

example, offers Peace Corps writers the chance to earn their MFA in creative writing; while at New Mexico State University, RPCVs have the choice to pursue a doctorate in economic development. Did you know you can go to law school through the Fellows/USA program? At the University of Cincinnati a tenacious RPCV can get a Master of Community Planning coupled with a JD. The truly driven can stay there and pursue their PhD as well, all while reaping the benefits—financial, social and otherwise—of being part of the Fellows/USA program. Chris Aufrey and Johanna Looye, who coordinate the Fellows/USA program at the University of Cincinnati, are impressed by the “richness of experience” that RPCV Fellows contribute to the overall learning experience of the student population. This outcome ratchets up the educational growth of all the members of the various master’s cohorts, and creates a far more rich experience for everyone. This effect is

but one of the important secondary benefits Fellows/USA participants discover in their programs.

Getting a Master of Criminal Justice can be the ideal career stepping-stone for some RPCVs, and you don’t have to look beyond the Fellows/USA program to do it. The University of Colorado, Denver offers it up, as well as being the site of another one-of-a-kind Fellows/USA PhD program in public affairs. Most of the RPCVs eligible for the University of Colorado, Denver’s Fellows/USA program already have master’s degrees, according to Fellows/USA coordinator Christine Martell. Therefore, she describes the participating students as ones who are interested in a second master’s in criminal justice or public administration, or a PhD in public administration. A PhD candidate for the Fellows/USA program there has just been selected for next year, and Martell hopes that the candidate’s paid internship with the State Department

of Health Care Financing and Policy will compliment work she's already done both in the Peace Corps and previous to her Peace Corps service.

At Monmouth University, the Master of Social Work degree with a concentration on international and community development attracts many RPCV fellows. Robin Mama, the coordinator for Fellows/USA at Monmouth, points out that the "grounding in social justice of the social work programs draws students interested in international studies, political science, peace studies, and international relations" which, of course, are all areas of interest for many RPCVs. Mama emphasizes the fact that RPCVs contribute to the overall academic environment by "making a big difference in the classroom, especially in discussions. They relate to our international and human rights content directly, and can give great examples from their work abroad. RPCVs are wonderful resources."

Because RPCVs who have successfully completed Peace Corps service have lifetime eligibility for Fellows/USA, many of the Fellows/USA programs are excellent

starting places for RPCVs contemplating a career change or wanting to bolster a chosen career path. The internships that always parallel a degree program through Fellows/USA allow participants to get on-the-job training in their chosen career area, which enables Fellows to graduate with not only the degree, but also with real world training in their field.
